Understudies (New play)

A new dark comedy about two understudies who set out to kill their very famous lead actors to take over their roles in the West End. Will they get away with it? And will the play be better with them in it?

Shylock in New York (New play optioned to the Royal Court for production in 2026)

It's 1978 and Arnold Wesker is about to open his new play, The Merchant, on Broadway. With John Dexter directing and legendary comic actor Zero Mostel playing Shylock, it's destined to be a huge hit. But when its leading actor dies on opening night, everything starts to fall apart and Wesker must fight to keep his dreams alive. A true story.

Bitch (New screenplay)

A young woman trained from early childhood to fight in cages for the pleasure of men escapes her underground prison and flees into the woods. A new life seems possible when she is befriended by fearless, clever seven year old girl... until her owners discover where she is and come to take her back. A new female-led action feature length film inspired by E.T., Gladiator, Mad Max and Frankenstein.

Lambs (Available play. Commissioned by Guildford School of Acting, 2024)

A workplace drama exploring the human cost of working in UK slaughterhouses and the challenges faced by nine workers over the course of six months.

Frankenstein (Available play. Commissioned by Inside Out Theatre, Beijing, 2019)

Set in an interrogation room, two detectives challenge Victor to explain why he killed his wife. Instead he begins to tell them a story about the undead creature he has brought to life and the vengeance it has wrought in return. But nothing is as it seems as the detectives will discover. A contemporary reimagining of Mary Shelley's Frankenstein, originally commissioned and performed at Inside Out Theatre in Beijing and on a National Tour of China.
